Biographical Notes and Lineage for THE PALMER – EDWARDS CONNECTION

The Palmer/Mansell/Rowe/Edwards Connection from VA, SC, GA, AL, MS submitted by Barbara Lee Rowe

The Palmer family came into the Presley line via the Mansell connection. The patriarch of the Palmer family was **Ellis** (**Elias**) **Palmer**, born 1725 in Virginia and married to **Anne Rudd**. The Palmers, Georgia branch, intermarried with the Mansell, Rowe, Edwards families to name a few. This is one connection the Presley line:

"In 1816 **Hezekiah Palmer** sold his land in Union Co. S.C. and moved to Green Co. Ga. Near Richland Creek, and his brother, Amasa, and sister Nancy, wife of **William Edwards**, was living therebefore Jan. 7, 1811. Hezekiah was a farmer and a preacher also a blacksmith, a trade Absolam Roberts his father-in-law taught him. Hezekiah died in Benton County, Alabama leaving twelve children and wife, Elizabeth... active up until her death in the 1850s. She now rests in the New Zion church cemetery, Marion County Alabama.

NOTE: Benjamin Palmer served in the Colonial Army during The Revolutionary War. He lived near Brown's Creek, in Union County, South Carolina, until 1816 when he moved to Greene County, Georgia where, on February 27, 1816, he bought 20 acres of land from John Oslin. This land was on the waters of Richland Creek. On November 14, 1817 he bought 100 acres, more or less, from Edward Woodham. Benjamin sold his land to his older son, Elijah, on August 10, 1819 and moved to Hancock County, Georgia, at, on Shoulder Bone Creek and the Oconie River. He was a farmer and a preacher in the Fairforest Church. He and his family lived just across the river from the Indians and about 1829 they moved to Walton County, Georgia. In 1831, he, his wife Elizabeth Roberts Palmer and three of their 12 children, Russell Porter, Joseph Marvin and Benjamin Franklin, moved to Benton County, (later named Calhoun County) Alabama, where they lived again among the Indians. The rest of their children were left in 1 CONC Georgia. Benjamin Hezakiah died in Benton County, Alabama in 1839. Elizabeth Roberts Palmer and her three sons Left Benton County and came to Marion County, Alabama in 1844. After Benjamin Hezakiah's death everything the family owned was sold at public auction, with Elizabeth and the children buying back whatever they wanted. For example, Elizabeth bought back all her pots, pans and silverware. It isn't known if the sale was forced upon them for some reason or ifthis was just a way the family decided upon to get the money to travel on and start a new home when they got to their destination. At the time of Benjamin's death, the family owned one young male slave. This slave was sold for onethousand dollars, an unusually high sum of money for the year of 1838.

Obituary for Ida Sybilla Rowe Palmer (submitted by Barbara Lee Rowe)

"Mrs. Ida Palmer died April 20 at the age of 85.

Mrs. Ida Rowe Palmer died April 20 at the home of a daughter, Mrs. O. W. Hattaway of Monroe. She had been ill for seven weeks. Funeral services were held at 3 pm Wednesday from the Campton Methodist Church of which she was a consecrated member for many years. Rev. Clyde E. Smith, Rev. Paul Fry, and Rev. Tom Gassaway served as the officiating ministers and the E.L. Almand Company had charge of the arrangements. Burial followed in the church cemetery.

Born in Walton County in 1868, Mrs. Palmer was 85 years, nine months, and 21 days old at the time of her death. She was the daughter of the late Charles Bradley Rowe and Mrs. Mary King. Her husband, the late Robert Calvin Palmer, succumbed Sept. 29, 1938"
